This hybrid, part-time position (20 hours/week) requires at least one day a week in our Cheakamus Lake Road office in Whistler, with fieldwork around Whistler.

Founded in 1989, AWARE is Whistler's environmental charity, tackling major challenges like climate change, biodiversity loss, and waste management. The Zero Waste Campaigner will lead initiatives to advance our community's Zero Waste Goals, emphasizing the importance of community engagement alongside policy efforts. Key tasks include revitalizing the Diversion Plan with a focus on Residential and Commercial Organics Diversion.

Ideal candidates will have a minimum 3 years experience as a Campaigner or in a similar role. Candidates will also be passionate about our mission, possess experience in building and leading strategic campaigns, and understand the connections between waste management and climate change. Strong writing, communication skills, and a track record in community engagement are essential.

- **Revitalize the Diversion Plan**: Focus on enhancing Residential and Commercial Organics Diversion efforts.


